14 Acres Purchased for **Urban Parks**

Charleston County Council awarded \$890,755 to the cities of North Charleston and Isle of Palms to use toward the purchase of land for urban parks.

The City of North Charleston used \$416,450 of their urban Greenbelt funds to purchase 12 acres for passive public parks.

Two projects totaling 11

acres are located along O'Hear Avenue and are adjacent to other Green-

belt properties that will be combined for a park along Noisette Creek, providing the public with passive park opportunities and access to the creek for fishing and crabbing.



E. Enterprise Street, N. Chas.

North Charleston also purchased a .75-acre parcel along E. Enterprise Street for a neighborhood park. The property is in close proximity to a large recreational center owned by the city. The park will provide much desired open space in a densely developed neighborhood.

The City of Isle of Palms purchased a one acre parcel with their Greenbelt funding of \$474,305. The property is located next to the Island Center shopping center and is easily accessible from the most heavily used beach area. The property is undevel-

oped and contains 25 historic live oak trees. The city will gather input from the public on how they wish to utilize the property in the future.

City of Folly Beach Provides ADA Accessible Beach Walkover

The City of Folly Beach used their remaining urban Greenbelt funds of \$15,737 to place a beach walkover on a 50-foot right of way near the Folly Beach washout. The project will provide an American with Disabilities Act (ADA) accessible beach walkover. This will be the fourth option for access to the beach by those with physical disabilities. In addition the city will provide two handicapped parking spaces at the site.


